

## **COVID Update April 2021**

The temps are rising, buds are forming, and it seems we are beginning to really take the first significant steps to emerge from the health crisis. So, naturally, we are asking questions about a return to in-person gatherings for worship, learning, connecting, and even serving. The good news is that without a doubt these new opportunities are coming, and sooner rather than later. Our church leaders have begun to form plans for each of these in the coming weeks and months, if the way be clear.

Before diving into some of our plans, let's take stock for just a moment where we are right now. Nationally there is a lot of good news as the vaccine roll-out is in full swing with three different options on the market and the news that increased doses will be delivered in the coming weeks. Closer to home the picture gets a bit more grim (at least in the short-term). New Jersey right now is among the worst in the country for new cases, even as other states like NY and CT have become more open. The local conditions are not any better. The Greater Westfield area had been holding steady with an average of 50 new cases per week, but spiked last week by 50%; much of this has been attributed to the newer variants of the virus, which spread more easily. As the leaders of Nassau Presbyterian Church in Princeton commented recently, "there is a race between the vaccination rate and the rate of infection." Various news outlets have been calling this the race between vaccines and variants.

This is what we mean by, "if the way be clear." First and foremost, we are planning a return of PCW on the Lawn with:

**Easter morning prayer and worship at 8am on the Lawn** – more casual approach to greeting the resurrection morning where participants will be encouraged to bring chairs and coffee;

Weekly Sunday gatherings on the Lawn at Noon starting April 18<sup>th</sup> – ranging from worship to study to connecting and always with prayer, these gatherings will aim to give participants an expansive experience as conditions continue to improve.

Of course, both weather and the health crisis could derail these plans, but the aim is to get moving in April and, as conditions allow, to eventually expand our offerings through the summer.

In addition to this, plans are underway to have a local High School Mission Trip this summer and Agape sees some expansion of its ministry possible sometime in the summer.

# Clerk's Corner-Highlights of the March Meeting

The Moderator's Report from Jeremy included a summary of the first quarter of 2021 and where we are headed.

#### What we have accomplished and are working on:

#### **Programmatic Ministry:**

- Parish Associate, Tom Kort, offered two different Bible studies linked to the worship series.
- Faith Formation has worked especially hard to keep our family ministries and offerings for children fresh and energetic. Virtual Worship on Wednesdays (WOW) at 5 pm and children's Sunday School at 9:30 am are available during Lent via Zoom.
- Youth ministry and fellowship are continuing online with plans for further gatherings as the weather gets warmer.
- Missions including the work in Youth Ministry through Agape Elizabeth and Agape Local are still impacting the local community.
- Worship has been carrying out its work to allow for the worship life of the church to remain unencumbered by the pandemic, while also keeping a close eye on when in-person gatherings will be possible (maybe mid-April).

#### **Supportive Ministry:**

- Stewardship worked through the winter to do the annual stewardship campaign with better-than-expected participation from our church community and a deepening sense of commitment to the ministry we do through this church. Erik Ely, from Generis, has started working with Stewardship to develop a long-term ministry effort for generosity. Erik attended the first part of the Session meeting to introduce himself.
- Office and Property has been working on maintaining and improving our physical plant so that it will better serve the local community as our doors reopen to the public in the coming months. The team is actively expanding membership and taking a leadership role in developing clear processes for its work.
- A Task Force led by Liz Miller and Laure Park is reevaluating our needs and desired ministry outcomes so that we can better align our technological and communication tools. The foundation of this project lies in updating our database but will likely include investments in other areas to help us live into a stronger future- connecting and engaging with members and new faces more easily. The task force has met with office staff to understand how the current database works. They also met with several Commissions to discuss current and future functionality.
- A new Task Force has been formed to take a close look at the landscape of our church- especially the front lawn- to
  ensure that we are maximizing its ministry utility while remaining a beautiful park-like setting.

#### **SESSION UPDATES:**

• The United Fund of Westfield needs to move out of their current space in the next few weeks. There may be an opportunity for PCW to provide them office space for the short term or long term.

# **Agape Local Food Boxes**

Health and Social Services Agencies are reporting that, as a result of the pandemic, one in four families does not have enough to eat. In addition, at least one study shows a 170% increase in food insecurity among families with children under the age of twelve. Households that never relied on any assistance before, find themselves jobless or with hours/wages drastically cut resulting in an inability to obtain life's basic necessities.

For the last eight months, PCW has been working to provide healthy, fresh food and some essential household supplies to 107 of our neighbors in need. Each week, a list of specific requests is created and circulated in our email blasts and on our website. Church members and Friends of PCW choose the items they wish to donate, and

bring them to the church. Some donors have opted to send monetary contributions which are used to supplement the food bags with protein sources and additional fresh fruit and vegetables. On Fridays, Agape Local volunteers assemble the bags and distribute them to the families.

# Congregational Meeting Treasurer's Report

Alan Smith, the Treasurer for PCW since January 2019, shares with the congregation an update of the financial health of our church and to highlight how we are all stewarding the resources that God has provided to us. This will include a summary of our 2020 performance, and our expectations for 2021, and will cover the church, the endowment (or legacy reserve), and PNS&K (nursery school).

This past year was an exceptional year in so many ways. We continued to operate smoothly despite the unanticipated difficulties. We met our ministry goals of increasing our relevance with the people surrounding us, and our commitments to our employees and suppliers despite the impacts from the COVID pandemic.

As you can see from the attached table of our 2020 audited results, PCW's ministries generated \$3.6MM in contributions and proceeds, and our reserves grew by over \$700K. But when compared with last year's performance, you can see that our ministries were substantially reduced (by nearly 20%). You also can see that we worked diligently to reduce expenses, doing so while maintaining our commitment to employees and suppliers.

We raised nearly \$800K from pledgers during 2020, which is only 6% less than what we achieved in 2019 when things were more normal, and for this we are very grateful to you all. We received \$468K in government loan for both the nursery school and the church (called the Payroll Protection Program or PPP; efforts are underway to convert all or part of this to a grant). And we also received several bequests, grants and other designated donations that play a key role in supporting our efforts (although at a smaller dollar amount than 2019).

While giving continues to be a primary source for supporting our ministries, we again used a portion of the earnings from prior years' gifts to sustain our commitments to ministry programs and staff. Without use of this legacy reserve, we would have shown a \$770K loss. This tells us that your ongoing contributions are critical to our ongoing success, but still have a way to go to fully cover our current operating costs.

Our external auditors shared a draft report and gave us a 'clean bill of health' from a financial accounting perspective for our 2020 management process. The auditors reviewed the operations of the church, the use of our legacy reserve or endowment funds, as well as the nursery school.

We have 16 members actively engaged in the stewardship processes of PCW (led by elder Gary Zanfagna) along with several members of our church staff (centered around Tina Barulli). These processes are led by the Stewardship Commission with support from the Investment and Finance Committees. I would like to thank these individuals for their dedication and contribution to being effective stewards of the money that God has provided to PCW, as well as the funds that today's members give to further God's kingdom in our community and beyond. Should you like to be a part of this team effort, please reach out to Gary Zanfagna, Tina Barulli, Jeremy or me. We will work to find you a home that utilizes your skills and interests.

As we look to 2021, PCW is planning to return to more normal levels of ministries and programs with in-person worship and face to face group meetings, larger class sizes and more. This is likely to result in both larger revenues and expenses than 2020 but likely less than 2019. It is too early to forecast an outlook on the net outcome, but our budgeting process indicates that we should expect a similar operating loss and use of the legacy reserve. Please look to future Treasurer's Reports for updates on our 2021 outlook.

Your response of generosity from what God has given to you and what you feel called to support God's mission here at PCW are of continued importance and we thank you very much for it.

Copies of this report are available from the church office and the audit report should be available by the end of April. I am also available to speak with you personally to address questions by leaving me a message with the office staff.




# **Lunch and a Book**
