Welcome Home for Christmas

Friends, we have entered the season waiting, the Advent of our Lord and the approaching joy of Christmas. After the sorrows of the past – almost – two years, we are enjoying in-person and digital worship among other ways of connecting.

This season we have weekly opportunities for Sunday worship in both Westminster Hall and the Sanctuary, but wait! There's more! You can help us *Deck the Halls* on December 3rd at 9:30am to get into the Christmas spirit. Our family ministries will be holding a special viewing of *The Grinch* in the sanctuary on Wednesday, December 8th for kids of all ages at 5pm. We are also hosting a special *Carols, Cookies, and Cocoa* on December 12th at 3pm to enjoy some outdoor time together. Now for worship, we have a special *Longest Night* worship service on December 21, at 7pm for anyone who experiencing grief through the holidays, or noticing broken places in their life, or facing the woes of society. We expect it to be a time carved out to meet God in some of the darker places of life.

Last year we were unable to meet in person for Christmas Eve; this year we anticipate being able to do so. In case you have missed this information elsewhere, you can worship in-person with us for three very different services: at 5pm we will have our Family Christmas Service; at 7pm *wired* will meet in Westminster Hall; and at 9pm we will return to the Sanctuary for a Candlelight service with Communion. If you are unable to meet in-person we will also have a video worship experience on YouTube and Facebook Live starting at 7pm. Remember, we have childcare available with all staff and volunteers working with kids masked and vaccinated.

There is so much to look forward to this year that was sorely missed last year. That said, there is one thing we are not looking forward to, and that is saying goodbye to Parish Associate, Rev. Dr. Tom Kort at the end of the year. Tom came on board one year ago to help us through the deepest time of the pandemic, which was raging as we were without pastoral support. The agreed time was

one year, and with a full staff we have the bittersweet task of saying thank you for the many ways Tom has blessed the life of this congregation, from his excellent preaching, prayers and worship leadership, to the new life he breathed into our Bible studies. Personally, I have grown to love his advice and wisdom as a mentor and friend in ministry. Be sure to take a moment in the coming weeks to say thanks to Tom.

<u>Clerk's Corner</u>

Highlights of the November 9, 2021 Session Meeting

Moderator's Report- Look to the Horizon

Rev. Jinkins said that an immense amount of work is coming to fruition. It includes the budget process, capital projects, new initiatives, and new staff. In a few months we will be moving from the planning to the launching stage. The new software will be ready to start implementation; staff is in place to start their work; the new data base will provide opportunities to impact not only members but the community at large; and we will be making a major investment in technology. Office & Property met last night with the ITT team to review where we are. Jeremy said that it is important to remember the "WHY"- what grounds us is the vision of "Life Change Starts Here." Every ministry can provide life changing experiences that prepare us to follow Christ into the world. Everything we are doing now will help us make a bigger impact in the next few years in engaging our neighbors and community.

Session Updates:

- Generosity Update and Future Plans- Bill Tittle reported that he is pleased with the current results. 153 Pledges totaling \$675,000 have been received so far. The 124 pledges from people who gave last year, and this year show the giving amount is up 20%. The Generosity team will be following up with people that have not pledged yet. Further updates will be given during the worship services. Bill said the Finance Committee reports that the second PPP is being reviewed by the Small Business Association for full forgiveness, which Bank of America has recommended. He thanked Alan Smith for his hard work. He also reported that so far things are going well with the Finance Committee.
- 2. Susan Dougherty announced that Outreach and Welcome will be hosting a community carol sing called "Carols, Cookies and Cocoa" on December 12,2021 from 4-5 pm. They need people to help with this event. There are currently only four members on the commission. She will send an email to Session outlining the help that is needed.
- 3. "Call-A-Thon" Reach Out to Congregation by Session, Deacons & Stewardship- Dan Swartz/Will Murtishaw: Dan reported that Deacons had been reaching out to many people in the Congregation during this time of Covid and mostly meeting on- line. They now want to connect with people to let them know that we are meeting in-person, let them know that Marcy and Sara are here and to tell them about upcoming planned activities. It is also a way to validate contact information that is in the computer system and update it as needed. There will be script provided.
- 4. Rev. Jinkins spoke about the Church Management System (church's CRM system) that will expand our ability to communicate digitally both full blast and to targeted groups. Gerry Lorenzetti announced that Jennifer Crawford has been hired to be the CMS Implementation person. Gerry thanked Liz Miler and Laure Park for networking and finding three candidates to interview. Jennifer has experience in implementing CRM systems in school districts; bringing stake holders on board and is good at working with people. A Steering Committee will be put together and she will be meeting with Commissions during November and December. Implementation of the system will start January.
- 5. Technology Team Update Martha Kieczykowski referred people to her updated report that was sent out earlier this afternoon after the joint meeting with Office & Property. The goal is to find a partner for us to move forward with. The plan is to hire Dan Fishman, an outside consultant, to assist our in-house experts in reviewing the Requests for Proposals and choosing the integrator (solution provider) to partner with us. Dan Fishman has much experience in the Atlanta area. She said the Analysis Phase comes next.
- 6. Budget Discussion- Alan Smith thanked the Moderators and their Commissions for their work on the budget. Ethan Harris spoke about Mission Commission more systematically drawing on the Betty McDiarmid fund rather than the regular endowment. Betty McDiarmid's will did not specify how the money should be spent. A prior Session approved a motion that the money be used for Mission. Alan said that a prior Session approved a motion that 10% of pledge dollars is be spent on Mission. Ethan reported that money for the empowerment funds has been sent to Zambia. The water project for the well and infrastructure will take some time to develop. The Synod in Africa is collaborating with us and Zambia. The question was asked why not fund \$75,000 from the Betty McDiarmid fund. The Session consensus was that when people pledge money to the church that a portion of it is expected to fund mission not just the church operating budget. Ethan Harris made *Motion #3: "Mission Commission moves to spend \$35,000 from the Betty McDiarmid endowment fund to partially fund the "Mission-Unspecified" line item"*. The motion passed with one no vote, one abstention and the rest yes votes.
- 7. Executive Session- All staff and visitors were excused. The Moderator turned the meeting over to Pam Shaw, Clerk of Session to moderate the rest of the Session meeting.
 - 2022 Terms of Call- Gerry Lorenzetti, Personnel Moderator, presented the 2022 Terms of Call for Rev. Jeremy Jinkins.
 - There was discussion about the use of the endowment to balance the budget.

• Stewardship- Bill Tittle made the *Motion #4: "The Stewardship Commission moves to accept the budget for 2022 as presented"*. The motion passed unanimously.

Staff Reports

Jeremy Jinkins, Pastor, Head of Staff: Jeremy thanked Lou Ann for her support and all she has done over the past 14 years. He said she has been a pleasure to work with and has saved Jeremy many times from making a mistake since he has been here.

Lou Ann Kaplonski, Church Administrator, said this was her last Session meeting. Her last day will be November 30, 2021. She said that she has loved working at PCW but her current job is huge and she needs to step away and do something else.

It is time to utilize the lessons we have been learning over the years, and to open a conversation with all seekers to interpret the teaching of Jesus and advance our faith journey.




