

Update From Our Senior Pastor

In June, we are planning a major expansion of our worship offerings here at The Presbyterian Church in Westfield. We will have in-person, indoor worship on **Sundays at 10am** in both the Sanctuary, and Westminster Hall for our *wired* worship experience. We will also maintain our at-home **worship packets** and our weekly digital worship on **YouTube** and **Facebook Live**. This has all been made possible by rapidly changing conditions in our local area. Governor Murphy has lifted many restrictions- following the recommendations of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention; therefore, our lives are slowly returning to what once was. (Please note: at some point in the future, we look forward to returning to our 8 am worship in the Chapel.)

SO WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR IN-PERSON WORSHIP AT OUR CHURCH?

We want worship to be a place that is safe and comfortable for everyone. I am grateful for the combined efforts of our Communications and Worship commissions shown below. To respect the many different thoughts we each bring on risk and safety this is what we are asking of you.

Masks:

- Fully vaccinated members may choose to wear their masks for the safety and comfort of others.
- Unvaccinated members are to wear their masks.
- Masks must be worn for singing and humming.

Social Distancing:

- For the safety and comfort of all members we will continue to keep social distance seating in place.
- You can seat yourself. Blue tape markers will indicate where you can sit in the Sanctuary. Chairs will be grouped appropriately in Westminster Hall.

Pre-Registration:

- We will no longer require preregistration. It is okay to just show up.
- We will no longer require temperature checks.

I am grateful for Josh McMahon, Nancy Smith, Pam Shaw, Beyanka Wheatley, Dr Bill Ainslie and the Worship Commission, along with a large number of other leaders in our church who have worked on this plan and its communication. Please look to our website and social media for updates and a "Frequently Asked Questions" resource to stay on top of changes over the summer.

Clerk's Corner Highlights of the May 11, 2021 Regular Session Meeting

Examination of Elders Elect and Deacons Elect

- The Elders and Deacons that were elected in March 2021 attended the May Session meeting to be examined by the current Session. Jeremy led the "open book" examination with questions on the Confessions; the form of government with discussion about "shared leadership" between Ministers, Deacons and Elders; and discipline emphasizing that the underlying fabric of the Presbyterian judicial system is to help heal, not to punish. Everyone was put into small groups to hear each person's faith journey and why they said "yes" when they were asked for the specific position. When the group was back together Jeremy made the motion for the people that were examined to be ordained and installed. The motion passed unanimously.
- The Ordination/Installation vows will be part of the 10am online service on Sunday, May 23, 2021 (Pentecost Sunday).

In person Worship

- In person, inside worship on Sundays at 10 am with traditional in the Sanctuary and contemporary (wired) in Westminster Hall will start in June.
- The 8 am Sunday service will be "on hold" for the summer.
- The online service on Sundays at 10 am will continue.
- Home Delivery bags will continue to be distributed.
- As requirements are changing almost daily, please check future emails and the website for new "Frequently Asked Questions" to see what will be required when attending indoor worship services.

Session Updates:

- 1. Generosity Program Update- Gary Zanfagna said that he is passionate regarding the Generosity ministry and Erik Ley's guidance and knowledge. They are learning to rethink how we approach giving and stewardship. Mike Canavan and Liz Fischer are the co-chairs that are working directly with Erik. Erik has reached out to some households and plans to speak with approximately 20 households about PCW. Gary emphasized that Erik is here to help us be better stewards and to educate us on how we can help ourselves.
- 2. Personnel Update- Gerry Lorenzetti reported:
 - Tina Barulli's retirement date has been amended to 8/31/21.
 - Krista Aslanian has been hired as the part-time, temporary Christian Education Coordinator.
 - Tom Kort's contract was extended until 12/31/21.
 - A subcommittee is reevaluating Tina's job and exploring ways to be more effective and efficient. This subcommittee is in the "research" phase.
 - Personnel Commission and Staff has begun the annual evaluation process.
- 3. APNC Update- Courtney Nemec reported that the APNC's have been speaking with some great people. The two APNC's are meeting together more frequently to discuss possible candidates. They are looking forward to scheduling onsite interviews which could not really take place earlier due to Covid.
- 4. Office and Property (O&P) Capital and Major Repair Policy Statement- Mike Quinlan explained that O&P wanted to have an established process for projects, so they created the document that was shared with Session prior to the meeting.
- 5. Office and Property Project Update- Michael Quinlan made the motion: "Office and Property moves to approve the new lighting system in the Sanctuary at a cost of \$72,000". The quote was distributed prior to the Session meeting. Alan Smith said the monies for this project will come from Endowment funds. The motion was approved unanimously.

Celebration of Ruling Elder Ministries

Rev. Jinkins thanked Lisa Black and Barbara McLaughlan for their six years of ministry on Session as they faced many challenges and massive transitions.

Reflections on the last six years and hopes for the future by:

- Lisa Black- Lisa shared that ministers and Interim Ministers come and go but the members of the congregation are the church. She said she enjoyed the times of laughter and brainstorming. She thanked the Session for letting her use her gifts to serve the church. Her hope for the future is for everyone to use their gifts, share ideas, and move forward.
- Barbara McLaughlan- Barbara talked about the changes in ministers and music directors. She said that Worship Commission moved from "rubber stamping" to "being a part of the discussions". She said that Paul Sanner has had an impact with new ideas for worship. Barbara's advice for the future is hope based on Matthew 25.

Clerk's Report

- 1. Correspondence Received/Sent:
 - a. Received an Easter card from Margaret and Bill Brown who found PCW on YouTube.
 - b. Sent a thank you note to Kueichu Hsu thanking her for the donation in memory of her husband for the Revitalization Cemetery Committee.
 - c. Received an email to Session from Rev. Jinkins concerning Tina Barulli's pending retirement.
 - d. Received notification from St. Katharine of Siena, Wayne, PA that Carter Yearley, who was baptized at PCW on February 11.2007, was confirmed on November 21. 2020.
 - e. Rev. Jinkins received a request for funding from the Westfield Neighborhood Council. This was referred to the Mission Commission.
 - f. Received a letter from Mary Robinson at Imagine thanking PCW for their donation of \$5,500. The letter is included in the May Session Packet. Jeremy reported that Mary had called him to say that she is stepping out of the CEO position. She will be working more with the visioning of the company. Mary asked Jeremy to serve on the Imagine Leadership Board. This board is different from the Board of Trustees.

2. Administrative Business

- a. The Book of Order for Elders and Deacons Elect were ordered and distributed.
- b. Directions on downloading the Book of Confessions from PCUSA were distributed to Elders and Deacons Elect.
- c. Leadership training for current and newly elected Elders and Deacons was held via Zoom on Sunday, 4/18/21, and Sunday, 4/25/21 from 1-3pm. Training was provided by Rev. Tom Kort, Parish Associate, and Rev. Jeremy Jinkins.
- d. Barbara McLaughlan and Pam Shaw attended the Mission meeting of Union County for the Presbytery of Northeast New Jersey on April 27, 2021. Barbara volunteered to be the Union County Mission representative when all the counties in the Presbytery meet together.
- e. Ruling Elder assignments were distributed prior to the meeting.
- f. Pam explained that an email was sent to the families that have been waiting to have their children baptized. There are 13 families and 17 children requesting baptisms. They were offered 6/13/21, 8/8/21 and 9/12/21 at either the 10 am Traditional or 10 wired service. If there are too many requests for one day an additional Sunday may be added later in the month. Several families need to join the church before their child can be baptized. A Special Session meeting will be called to receive new members on the same day the Baptism is scheduled. Pam made the motion "To call a Special Session Meeting to receive new members on Sunday, June 13, 2021, at 9:15 am in the Chapel". The motion was seconded. The motion was approved unanimously.
- g. Jeremy explained that usually two Elders attend these Special Session meetings to receive new members, but he asked for as many Elders as possible to attend these summer meetings to welcome and get to know the new members.



Hoping you will join in on this effort of discernment about Christ's call for us. Should be an interesting journey. Please share this information with others that may be interested in joining the discussion.



AGAPE LOCAL

The pandemic finally seems to be slowly heading to an end. While many of us want to look forward with hope and optimism, there are families and individuals among us who cannot share such a positive view. They have been and continue to endure serious consequences from the major disruptions that began in March 2020. Recent reports coming from Health and Social Services Agencies deliver the grim news that one in four families does not have enough to eat. We find it hard to imagine these statistics exist in America, but at least one study shows a 170% increase in food insecurity among families with



children under the age of twelve. Households that never relied on any assistance before, found themselves jobless or with hours/wages drastically cut resulting in an inability to obtain life's basic necessities.

In answer to the hardships being endured by others, this church developed a program to help local families struggling to put food on their tables. It has been almost a full year through which PCW and members of this community have been working together to provide healthy, fresh food, and some essential household supplies to 107 of our neighbors in need. Each week, a list of specific requests is created and circulated in our email blasts and on our website. Church members and local residents we call "Friends of PCW" choose the items they wish to donate and deliver them to the Parish House. There were others who felt more comfortable sending monetary contributions. Those funds are used to supplement the food bags with protein sources (beef, chicken, turkey, etc.) and additional fresh fruit and vegetables. Every Friday morning, a small group of Agape Local Volunteers comes together in The Robinson Room to assemble the bags and distribute them to the families – all the while observing COVID restrictions.

These families truly are "the least of our brothers." If you are in a position to help this local effort – either by donating food items on the lists or making a contribution – we would welcome your participation.

Notes from the Presbytery of Northeast NJ- May 8, 2021

The following motions passed on the floor of the Presbytery:

- To approve the docket.
- To receive the requests to be excused.
- To approve the Minutes of the Stated Meeting held on March 13, 2021.
- To receive the report of the Commission on Ministry. *The request to commission Ruling Elder H. David Rogers* of Westfield to preside at the wedding of his Grandson which is to take place in Minnesota, at a wedding venue. This is permissible both by Minnesota law and by our book of order.
- To receive the interim report of the AC serving St. Augustine Presbyterian Church.
- To receive the Elizabeth Presbytery Treasurer's report.
- To receive the Palisades Presbytery Treasurer's report.
- To receive the Newark Presbytery Treasurer's report.
- To receive the report of the Newark Board of Trustees concerning the sale of 192 Broad Street.
- To receive the Nominating Committee's report.
- To adjourn the meeting.

The Rev. Dr. Diane Moffett and the Rev. Rosemary Mitchell spoke about the Matthew 25 initiative of the PC(USA). Their talk included the following slides. The Matthew 25 program is:

- Biblically Based
- Theologically Grounded
- Ecclesiastically Affirmed
- Practically Implemented
- Contextually Adoptable
- Affectively Life Giving

The Mission workplan is:

- 1. Build Congregational Vitality.
- 2. Eradicate Systemic Poverty
- 3. Dismantle Structural Racism.

Congregational Vitality:

The embodiment of Christian principles and practices that leads believers in congregations to actively engage the world, following Jesus in doing the work necessary to build God's kingdom.

Systemic Poverty:

- Systemic Poverty is the exploitation of people who are poor through laws, policies, practices, and an array of dynamics that lead to the perpetuation of an impoverished status.
- Poverty is lack of material and social capital to ensure basic wellbeing.

Structural Racism:

• Structural racism in the United States is the normalization and legitimization of an array of dynamics—historical, cultural, institutional, and interpersonal—that routinely advantages whites while producing cumulative and chronic adverse outcomes for people of color.

M. Vassar

• Structural Racism is a social construct designed to concentrate capital (material and social) within one group or race of people over others.

White Supremacy, White Privilege:

- White Supremacy is the belief that people differ along biological and genetic lines and that whites are superior to other groups.
- White Privilege is the advantage of having greater access to power and resources than people of color in the same situation do.

Matthew 25 Outcomes:

- Increase spiritual energy of congregations, mid councils, and other groups in the church.
- Increase **impact** of church in the world.
- Increase **new disciples** and participation in ministry.
- Ignite the Witness & Work of PCUSA and actively engage the world!

Matthew 25 Report- May 2021

- 43 Groups representing appx. 4,815 people,
- **821** Individual Congregations (10%)
- **9** Synods (56%)
- **65** Presbyteries (40%)

Under the above mid-councils' umbrella, there are **8,827** congregations of (9,000)

Following the presentation, we broke out into small groups to discuss the questions listed below. Everyone is welcome to continue to discern and discuss these questions during our ongoing weekly Zoom gatherings.

Questions for Discernment:

- What did you hear in the presentation that excited you? What caught your imagination?
- What is your church already doing that aligns with one of these foci: eradicating poverty, dismantling racism, or building congregational vitality?
- Our last small groups focused on the theme of creating welcome and hospitality as we become a new presbytery. How might Matthew 25 inform our creation of welcome and hospitality? Who are the least of these in your community? When have you been amongst them?
