

Today was a good day...

This morning I had the privilege to open three pieces of mail moments after arriving at the church.

The first was from a foundation that helps us fund our Agape ministry. With it was a check and all the perfunctory financial information about acknowledgment and the like. But it made me so proud of this church. Can you believe that the year 2020 marks 20 years of our Agape ministry? For 20 years our youth have organized a weekly ministry to our most vulnerable neighbors; more than that, this mission of ours has become an important way for adult members to mentor and support our youth and deepen their own engagement with the church and local community. This letter was more than an exchange of financial support. It is a marker of the impact we have as a church that continues to be recognized by long-term partners.

The second was from the Presbytery of Elizabeth with information about the upcoming year and our per capita apportionment (no the amount did not decrease; yes, it was a good letter). Here's why. We are a leading congregation for our presbytery. If we think in terms of hierarchy then our per capita is a payment to fund the next level up of leadership, but that is not how I see the relationship. The presbytery is not a central office; it is, rather, the whole of all the churches in our area and represents the relationships we have to one another. In this protracted time of change in the church, we represent the stabilizing force of supportive leadership.

The third letter was from Princeton Theological Seminary. We have created or supported two major scholarship funds at the seminary that continue to make theological education possible for students. The letters themselves were statements that showed the school is being a good steward of the resources. What made me smile was the stack of handwritten notes from students describing the impact these scholarships have had on their lives.

Later today I will sit with a group of leaders who collectively represent all the different groups of our church. We have been working and praying together to consider the best way to build our professional staff here at the church. What impresses me so much about this group is their ability to listen deeply to what this congregation has said it needs from the Mission Study and other "official" channels, but also in conversations at small groups, the choir, and Presbyterian Women circles. Our work is not done, and we have much more to communicate, but it is humbling to be in the presence of such leaders who seek to represent the people of this church while also listening deeply to the new thing God is up to in our midst.

Like I said, today was a good day, and as I reflect on one of the final days of 2019, I can tell 2020 will be a very Happy New Year.

NEW STUDY FOR ADULTS

Beginning January 19th there is a new 8-week adult educational series, "**Winter Prayer**" available for you! It is designed to help you find "the winter voice of prayer". This program is a collaboration with Professor MiGliore of Princeton Theological Seminary. Prof. MiGliore helped design the program and will be involved in the series.

Sessions will be conducted using a "small-group" format with 3 different dates and times:

Sunday after church from 11:30-1pm with a light lunch Tuesdays at 3-4:30pm Monday nights at 7:30-9pm

There will be some reading and reflection, but background in bible studies or church doctrines is not required. Our reference materials will be "A Grief Observed" by C.S. Lewis, "Lament for a Son" by Nicolas Wolterstorff, and "Rachel's Cry" by Prof. MiGliore. Several copies of the required reading will be available from our church library. Purchase of books can also be made from your local bookstore or from on-line sources.

This program will provide an opportunity to engage with others from around the church, to learn to pray together, and to leaninto the potential need of prayer as either you or others around you cope with change and sorrow. In addition, you get the opportunity of being at the start of what we hope will become a partnership full of new potential.

The following are some important dates and context for "Winter Prayer":

- **January 19th**: Professor MiGliore will participate in worship and then convene in the Christian Lounge (1st floor of the Parish House) for a light lunch and a discussion of *A Grief Observed* and *Lament for a Son.*
- Week of February 2nd We will read and discuss "Rachel's Cry"— chapters 1 and 2
- **February 16th**: Professor MiGliore will again participate in worship and conduct a bible study starting at 11:30 in the Christian Lounge (light lunch will be provided). Bible readings will be shared prior to the session.
- Weeks of March 1, 15 and 29th We will discuss the remainder of Rachel's Cry.
- **April 12th:** we will have a luncheon meeting with Professor MiGliore for a discussion and wrap-up to this program. This will be held at the Nassau Club in Princeton, NJ. (Carpooling and transpiration will be coordinated).

Westfield Historical Society

As part of The Westfield Historical Society's First Wednesday Luncheon series, Joan Schaible will talk on the subject "Victorian Death & Mourning Traditions" for January 8, 2020. Much of the 19th century was known as the Victorian period as was so named during the 60-year reign of England's Queen Victoria. Indeed, her influence was evidenced in American death and mourning practices which may appear morbid or strange today. During this presentation, explore preparation of the home and deceased, taphophobia, post-mortem photography, the wake, funeral service, internment, park
